The Nonprofit Sector Is a Major Employer and Contributes to a Strong U.S. Economy

- The nation's 1.6 million nonprofits employ 11.9 million workers, over 10% of the American workforce.¹
- The nonprofit sector is the third largest workforce in the country behind only the retail and manufacturing industries, and pays more than \$587.7 billion annually in wages.²
- Nonprofits contributed an estimated \$906 billion to the national economy, comprising 5.4 percent of GDP.³

Government Counts on Nonprofits to Deliver Critical Services in American Communities

- FEMA depends on social-service nonprofits like the American Red Cross and Salvation Army to provide mass care and other emergency services when disasters strike.
- Goodwill Industries® invests more than \$3 billion in job training and employment service programs, matching nearly dollar-for-dollar federal funds for adult, youth, and dislocated workers under the Workforce Investment Act.
- Nonprofit community health centers deliver health-care






Nonprofits Leading the Way in Meeting Needs of Community


Voters in the Midwest (44%) and West (47%) were even **more likely** to say they thought Nonprofits did the best job at meeting needs than voters in the Northeast (38%) and South (36%)

Congress & President Should Support Charities

In responding to COVID-19 pandemic, the Small Business Administration played a critical role protecting and advocating for businesses throughout the country. Nonprofits are the third largest employer in the U.S. and an essential service provider, yet there is not a similar agency in the government to protect and advocate for nonprofits.

Congress and the President need to take urgent action to provide support for charities, so that they can continue to provide help to our communities?




Universal Charitable Deduction
